You are welcome to join the second meeting of the book group reading *The Depth of Our Belonging: Mysticism, Physics, and Healing* (Producciones de la Hamaca, 2021) by Mary Conrow Coelho. This book is both a personal and sacred story. We will explore and celebrate changes in worldview that are a gift to Quakerism. There is no need for special knowledge of science. We will seek to enter deeply into a sacred story that includes the natural world. We will learn from the text and our discussions and from Mary's beautiful watercolors that decorate the book using the practice of *visio divina*, sacred seeing, or seeing with the heart.

At our first meeting we discussed the first 15 pages of Chapter 1, "Awakening Within Tragedy," up to the section "A Transformed Worldview." For our second meeting, please finish Chapter 1. When you read, underline passages that stand out for you and bring these and your questions the meeting. This is your time to share. Musings on Millennialism

"Millennialism" is defined as

The belief, expressed in the book of *Revelation to John*, that Christ will establish a 1,000-year reign of the saints on earth (the millennium) before the Last Judgment. More broadly defined, it is a cross-cultural concept grounded in the expectation of a time of supernatural peace and abundance on earth.

I am only part way into Elise Boulding's *Cultures of Peace: The Hidden Side of History* (Syracuse Studies on Peace and Conflict Resolution, 2000) and am finding much that is new to me to think about. I don't know why it's taken me so long to read this resource. For example, I learned that the roots of the New Story go way back. In the Chapter "Passion for Utopia," Boulding writes

The organic approach [to utopia] sees nature as evolving in its own way, and humans need only happily go along with nature. A transformation is taking place, and a new consciousness is needed on the part of humans to recognize the transformation and to work with it. The millennialist Jochim de Fiore wrote in the thirteenth century about the transformation. He declared that the Age of the Holy Spirit had arrived to replace the age pf the bureaucratic institutional church. People only needed to follow the paths opened up by the spirit to enter into this new age. The Anabaptist tradition [which includes Quakers] that grew from Fiore's teaching is utopian in the best sense of the word. [p.32-33]

Is the New Story simply carrying on this centuries-old tradition translated into modern times?

For modern day Quakers, utopia takes the form of experiments in communal living, many of which have failed. *Friends Journal*, <u>June/July</u>, <u>2021</u>, reviews several of these and also Beacon Hill Friends House, which is definitely not failing.
