ALDEA- The grant will support the construction of 62 efficient cookstoves in the rural Mayan Kaqchikel villages of Guatemala reducing the risk of respiratory illnesses for families (children are especially vulnerable) and will help protect the environment from deforestation. https://aldeaguatemala.org

Science Club for Girls is a leader in experiential STEM learning. (STEM is Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.) This Avison grant will be used to pay for program-related expenses required to launch new clubs. Sibling Connections runs programs for Massachusetts children in foster care to facilitate keeping connections with separated siblings. Straight Ahead Ministries proposed the Metro Boston Youth Re-entry Project. It works with youth offenders under 18, male and female, to prevent reoffending. UTEC requested funding for its "The 2Gen Center" which offers young parents work in their social enterprises while also learning within their educational program focused on attaining a high school equivalency degree. YMCA of Greater Boston seeks to address a lack of opportunities for positive interactions between law enforcement officers and low-income youth. The Avison grant will support a small program, called the
