Celebrated Canadian author, professor, and social activist Naomi Klein and Dr. Yuria Celidwen, a scholar of Indigenous Nahua and Maya descent from the highlands of Chiapas (Mexico), met with OBI Global Senior Fellow Bayo Akomolafe, a thinker whose work straddles the intersections between Indigenous studies, cultural psychology, and contemplative science. Together they explored the untrod path with feet unshod; they constructed a strange thesis that calls into question – if only for a moment – the anthropocentricity of hope in becoming-responsive to explosive transformations. They investigated the agency of grief, the invitation nestled within the idea that to stand a chance, we might need to fall.
