Fadi Quran is a strategist and advocate dedicated to building collective power for justice and human rights. As the founder of **Thiqa**, he is leading efforts to reweave Palestinian communities into networks of collective struggle in pursuit of freedom, justice and dignity after decades of fragmentation. Fadi serves as a **Senior Director at Avaaz**, supporting a global civic movement of over 69 million people to drive people-powered change on urgent issues. His journey has been shaped by frontline experiences: supporting villages against land confiscation, advocating for international law at Al-Haq, and being repeatedly arrested for civil disobedience by both the Israeli military and the Palestinian Authority. His insights have been featured in *The Economist*, CNN, *The Guardian*, Al Jazeera, NPR and more.



Leila Farsakh is Professor of Political Science at UMass Boston. Her publications include *Palestinian Labor Migration to Israel: Labor, Land and Occupation* and several edited volumes.
